Soon we will be officially in Spring here in the Northern hemisphere. This is once again an indication of how land/ place/geography has influenced theology, and our observance of the Christian calendar is centered in the Northern hemisphere and its lunar cycles and seasons. The Christmas season is shaped by our hemisphere's experience of winter as cold and dark, and the names and themes of this season of Lent, culminating in Easter, reflect this hemisphere's tilt toward the sun and our growing seasons.

"Wake Up World" - A Comprehensive Curriculum on the Climate Crisis for Faith Communities

Are you curious and concerned about the climate crisis? Would you like to learn more about climate science and the role of our faith as Christians?

"Wake Up World" is a curriculum/study that educates people the climate crisis and our role as people of faith. Authors of the study (Rev. Dr. M. Robert Dygert-Gearheart, Ordained Methodist Minister and Anita Dygert-Gearheart, MSW, ACSW, LCSW) believe that a basic education of the current situation leads to greater motivation to action, rather than greater despair. This study is a seven week study with an hour and a half sessions. It is designed to educate but also to inspire churches and individuals to action.

The study will be led by Rev. Courtney Randall. Rev. Randall is serving as the Mission Advocate in the Western Jurisdiction with Global Ministries alongside her husband, Rev. Dan Randall. Their older two children attend the Youth Group at Phillips. Rev. Randall is part of the Creation Justice Movement in the United Methodist Church and leads the Western Jurisdiction Creation Justice Movement. She works alongside churches who are building Green Teams and talks with churches about creation justice as part of our discipleship.

This study will be offered in person at Phillips UMC on Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:00 p.m. starting Thursday, March 9th. The class will be held on the following Thursdays: March 9, March 16, March 23, March 30, April 13, April 20.

I am so thankful for all of you who have helped me thru the years. You were there from the start when I had no idea what all needed to be done till now. Just to lend a hand or filling in for me during illness or vacation. Thank you! A special thanks to Rev. Marilyn, Pat Anderson and Sue Alleman who have been my confidantes and friends through all these years. Pat has been my right hand all these years and like a second mom to me since I lost mine. I couldn't have done everything without her. Just remember she's not me and she doesn't know everything I do. You have a wonderful caring staff here at Phillips that have always put in more time than they are compensated for. It's just the nature of these jobs and the character of the people you've employed. It really came home to me how long I have been here when our member Keith Kreychik passed away. Keitf was the one on SPR that hired me 25 years ago, on a 90 day probation period. I guess I did okay! Funny thinking on it, it never felt like **work** working here, more like a ministry.
